- need environmental license to test soil and ground and the condition of the ground (ledge, etc)
- the site will be surveyed and they will listen to our neighborhood concerns; ie, quality of the neighborhood that needs to remain the same, access points, city water access
- the biggest concern for all of us is the traffic issue (we all know how bad Rt. 69 is now without added access to a development)
- traffic engineer will evaluate the situation
- NEST will keep us informed as to the progress
